



Hello families and caregivers!

You are the most important part of your child's educational team and your expertise about your child is critical. We can't do this without you!

This year your child's school will be using a short questionnaire to build a better understanding of how things have been going with you and your child since schools have been out. Knowing how your family has been doing is imperative because your child does best when your family is doing well! This questionnaire is designed to learn more about your child, family, and what has gone well and may have been more difficult since the COVID school shutdowns.

The questionnaire is called the Family Social Emotional Education Partnership Index (F-SEEI) and it has 3 main areas: (1) your family's overall social emotional wellness, (2) your child's social emotional wellness, and (3) your experience with being involved in the school community as a family.

Your time is valuable. Therefore, the F-SEEI shouldn't take you more time to complete than it takes you to read this letter. It is worth your time because this information will be used to connect and communicate with you and your child more effectively. Also, the responses of all the families will be used to identify areas in order to create strategies and/or programs to support the school community.

This is a team effort and your child's team is not complete without you!
